



## **EPA Invites Public Comment on a Proposed Cleanup Plan for Quanta Resources Superfund Site in Edgewater, New Jersey**

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) issued a proposed cleanup plan to address contaminated sediment and surface water within the Hudson River at **the Quanta Resources Superfund site in Edgewater, New Jersey**. EPA's proposed cleanup plan calls for dredging contaminated sediment, replacing it with clean fill and placing a cap in several places to prevent further contamination of surface water. The plan also includes monitored natural restoration, long-term monitoring and maintenance, as well as institutional controls.

A 30-day public comment period on the proposed plan begins on Friday, **July 7, 2023** and ends on **August 7, 2023**. As part of the public comment period, EPA will hold an in-person public meeting on **July 25, 2023 from 6:30 to 9:00 PM at the Edgewater Community Center Gymnasium at 1167 River Road, Edgewater, New Jersey 07020**.
